Policy

Voter Registration

The Board of Trustees recognizes that community engagement and civic participation are important parts of a student's education. The Board also regards the right to vote as one of the most important rights of citizenship. Therefore, the Board delegates to the Chancellor the authority to provide administrative procedures concerning the process of student voter registration in the District, maintaining non-partisanship in the voter registration process.

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A good faith effort to distribute a mail voter registration form to each student enrolled in a degree or certificate program and physically in attendance at the institution.

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Forms are widely available to students at the institution.

Districts that do not operate an automated class registration system, on or before January 1, 2008, may implement an automated voter registration system within two years of when they begin operation of an

Districts must designate contact person to be contacted by the Secretary of State for distribution of voter registration cards.

Students with Disabilities

Yosemite Community College District and its colleges are designated as agencies for the registration of voters, including all offices in the State that provide state-funded programs primarily engaged in providing services to persons with disabilities.

Voter registration agencies designated under may include offices that provide services to persons with disabilities.

The following services shall be made available:

- Distribution of mail voter registration application forms.
- Assistance to applicants in completing voter registration application forms, unless the applicant refuses such assistance.
- Acceptance of completed voter registration application forms for transmittal to the appropriate State election official.

If YCCD and or its colleges provide service or assistance in addition to conducting voter registration, it shall:

- Distribute with each application for such service or assistance, and with each recertification, renewal, or change of address form relating to such service or assistance.
- Mail voter registration application form described in Section 2058(a)(2) of this title, including a statement that:
 - Specifies each eligibility requirement (including citizenship);
 - o Contains an attestation that the applicant meets each such requirement; and
 - Require the signature of the applicant, under penalty of perjury; or
 - Use the office's own form if it is equivalent to the form described in Section 2058(a)(2) of
 - Unless the applicant, in writing, declines to register to vote

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YCCD and its colleges shall provide a form that follows the recommendation of Title 52. 1 2 3
